DAY ONE

Perth to Geraldton | Western Australia's Coral Coast

Leaving Perth behind, we begin our journey north through the changing landscapes of the Coral Coast. Along the way we'll enjoy a relaxed lunch, meet passionate producers and arrive in Geraldton in time to settle into our oceanfront accommodation. As the sun dips over the Indian Ocean, we'll stretch our legs around the marina before gathering for rooftop drinks and a harbour-side dinner. It's the perfect introduction to the days ahead and a chance for our small group to start getting acquainted.

DAY TWO

Geraldton to Carnarvon | Surprise Treasures and Country Characters

Along the way we'll hear tales of pastoral life and maritime history before arriving in Carnarvon for dinner showcasing the region's produce.

DAY THREE

Carnarvon - The Food Bowl of the North

The Gascoyne is often called the miracle of the north, and today we'll discover why. We'll spend the day meeting growers and enjoying the flavours that thrive in this unlikely landscape, gaining a deeper appreciation of one of Western Australia's most remarkable food regions.

Carnarvon to Cheela Plains | Into the Outback

After a day on the road and a simple lunch along the way, we'll arrive at Cheela Plains Station where country hospitality, open skies and a surprising station dinner await.

After time with station owners and stories of life on the land, we journey towards one of Australia's most breathtaking national parks. As evening falls, we'll gather for sunset drinks and an alfresco dinner prepared by Tracey, surrounded by some of the oldest landscapes on earth.

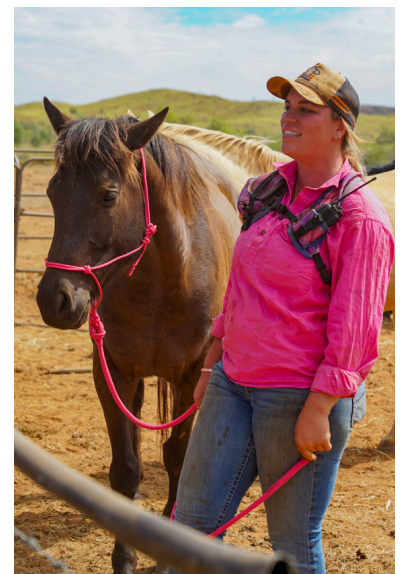
DAY SIX

Karijini National Park | Nature's Masterpiece

Today is devoted to exploring the extraordinary beauty of Karijini. We'll visit lookouts, wander gorge rims and discover crystal-clear pools framed by towering red cliffs. Those who wish can cool off with a swim beneath waterfalls before returning to camp. As the colours of the ranges deepen with the setting sun, we'll gather to share good food and wine beneath a blanket of stars.

DAY SEVEN

Karijini to Yarrie Station via Marble Bar | Into Cattle Country

Leaving Karijini behind, we'll journey to Marble Bar and pause for lunch at the legendary Iron Clad Hotel. Here we'll enjoy an unforgettable Outback Beef burger made with Yarrie Station beef and, if we're lucky, a yarn with the equally unforgettable owner who could keep us amused for hours with his stories. From Marble Bar we'll continue to Yarrie Station, where ancient landscapes give way to vast cattle country. After settling into camp, we'll gather around the fire for drinks before joining the station crew and hearing firsthand about life and work in one of Australia's great pastoral enterprises. Tonight, beneath the dark skies far from the distractions of everyday life, we'll experience the quiet magic of the outback.

DAY EIGHT

Living the Outback Cattle Station Life

This is a day to slow down and immerse ourselves in station life. Early risers can join the morning crew, while others can ease into the day with a campfire breakfast. We'll explore hidden waterholes and spectacular viewpoints, witnessing colours and landscapes that seem almost unreal. As the day draws to a close, we'll gather around the fire once more for laughter, stories and genuine outback hospitality.

DAY NINE

Yarrie to Pardoo Station | From Red Dirt to Blue Water

After farewelling Yarrie, we continue north to Pardoo Station where cattle country meets the Indian Ocean. The contrast between red earth and turquoise water is unforgettable. We'll finish the day with a walk along Eighty Mile Beach and enjoy Wagyu cooked over the coals as the sun sinks into the sea – one of those moments that lingers long after the journey ends.

DAY TEN

Pardoo Station | Coastal Station Life

Today offers a fascinating insight into one of Western Australia's iconic coastal cattle stations. We'll learn about the scale and complexity of station life and how Wagyu beef is farmed in this coastal environment. Lunch will be set out for you, surrounded by the natural beauty of Cape Keraudren. The afternoon provides time to simply relax and absorb the peaceful rhythm of this remarkable place before gathering on the homestead verandah for a 3-course dinner cooked by the station owners, featuring stunning world-class Pardoo Wagyu.

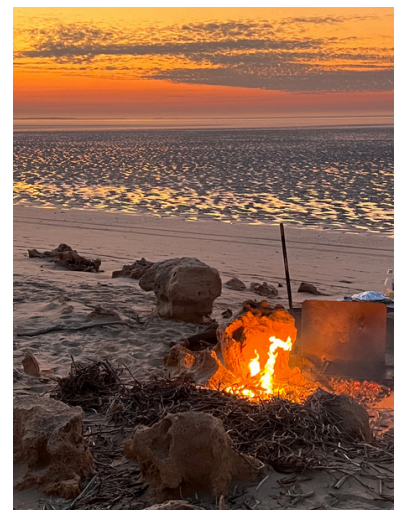
DAY ELEVEN

Port Hedland | Where the Pilbara Meets the World

Our final day takes us to Port Hedland, where the vast resources and industries of the north connect Western Australia to the world. At the Seafarers Centre we'll have lunch and learn about the lives of the often invisible ordinary seafarers who make it all happen. We'll board a launch to gain an appreciation of the scale of this remarkable port. The tour concludes at Port Hedland Airport, with timing designed to connect with afternoon flights back to Perth.

As our journey draws to a close, we leave with a deeper understanding of the people and places that sustain us. From sea to orchard to outback, we've met those whose daily work brings food to our tables - an insider's view of Western Australia that few travellers ever experience.

Handy things to know

Departure and Return - The tour departs from the Red CAT Tourist Bus Stop at Barrack Street Jetty, Perth. Departure time is 8.30am. The tour concludes at Port Hedland Airport, with timing designed to suit afternoon flights back to Perth. Daily flights are available with Qantas and Virgin Australia.

Travel Insurance - Comprehensive travel insurance is strongly recommended. While the Royal Flying Doctor Service provides emergency retrieval throughout remote Western Australia, travel insurance offers additional protection for illness, cancellations and unforeseen circumstances.

Dietary Requirements - Due to the remote nature of the journey and our constantly changing locations, we are unable to cater for allergies or special dietary requirements. Guests should be comfortable with a varied menu and simple meals on travel days.

Safety and Permits - Matters of Taste carries public liability insurance and all required permits and approvals for National Park access and station visits are maintained. Your safety and comfort are always our priority.

Our Vehicle and Experience - Your hosts, Tracey and Anthony Cotterell, will accompany you throughout the journey. Anthony grew up on the land and has extensive experience driving in regional and remote Western Australia. Our comfortable purpose-built 4WD touring vehicle allows us to safely access places that larger coaches simply cannot reach, while providing excellent visibility and a relaxed travelling experience.

Meals and Drinks - Meals included in the itinerary are provided. Additional meals and snacks may be purchased individually. Wine and beer are included with hosted dinners from Karijini through to the end of the tour. Alcoholic beverages at restaurants and licensed venues are available for guests to purchase.

Camping - Camping is comfortable and private, with each guest having their own sleeping tent. Shower and washing facilities are simple but practical, and all campsites have toilet facilities. Many guests find camping beneath the stars to be one of the highlights of the journey.

What to Bring - Please bring a sleeping bag, pillow, towel and head torch, along with toiletries and casual clothing suitable for warm days and cooler evenings. Comfortable walking shoes, a hat and sunscreen are essential. Please use a soft bag or backpack for your belongings. These fit well into our vehicles compact storage spaces.

Typical August Weather - Early August brings some of the most pleasant weather of the year. Geraldton averages around 20°C during the day and 13°C overnight. Carnarvon enjoys daytime temperatures around 23-25°C with cool evenings around 12°C. In the Pilbara, daytime temperatures are typically 27-30°C, while nights can cool to 14-18°C. A light windcheater or fleece is recommended for evenings and early mornings.



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
